(SP/WHS M1) Urban Dynamics: Challenges of Urban Development in Megacities

Our world is becoming more and more urban. Today the urban population already holds a share of more than fifty per cent of the world population - in 2030 it is predicted to be more than sixty per cent. The seminar provides insights into the main drivers of this global urbanization processes and its phenomena as well as upcoming challenges for urban development and (international) policies. The focus will be on the urban agglomerations described as megacities (and those on their way) which can be seen as indicators of the dynamics described above. Globalization and industrialization, urban growth and sprawl, the environmental damage done and the vulnerability to the impacts of the manmade climate change are some of the key terms to be discussed and illustrated by taking a closer look at metropolitan areas in the Southern hemisphere, where most of the global urbanization takes part.

The participants will contribute to the content with the analysis of sectoral approaches, integrated strategies and relevant cases. The seminar will be held in English and is addressed to students of the master courses/ diploma courses Urban and Regional Planning as well as to students of the master course World Heritage Studies. Students presentations have to be held in English, the final paper can also be written in German.

(22-5-04) Architecture, City, Space. Habitat Heritage Site.

Learning OutcomeThis seminar develops an understanding of the interrelation of architecture, city and space. The module aims to generate a basic understanding of the complexity of architecture, city and urban planning in relation to world heritage sites. The module "Architecture, City, Space" will teach basic structural and construction related knowledge as well as a first approach to architectural tools and media and the basic understanding of architectural, urban and spatial concepts. In contrast to looking at architecture as an object consisting of certain elements to be assembled in certain styles, this course aims to raise awareness for architecture in a more holistic way. Architecture is seen as a tool to define the relation between human and the built environment. The investigation of the multiple layers of architecture such as the spatial, the social, the material and the temporal are crucial to the seminar. **Architecture for People: Designing Convivial Places** As a continuation of the previous seminar 'The character formation of settlements', which studied the formation of urban character in public housing projects, this year's seminar will analyse aspects of public and cultural buildings throughout history. The study will start with the origin of public gathering spaces and will explore how both interior and exterior 'public room' spaces are accessible and a place for community gathering and cultural interchange. Understanding the principles of convivial space, applied in the agora and forum of antiquity, the seminar will progress as to how these qualities have developed into public building typologies throughout medieval and contemporary eras. The aim is to understand the importance of developing beyond the notions of 'first and second spaces', namely living and working environment into a 'third space' (1) centred for community living and gathering. Related to the study, the meaning of the local in the context of globalization today will be discussed. The seminar will demonstrate how local cultural and environmental conditions influence the character of the studied spaces. Further, provide opportunity to understand contextual constraints and the appreciation of vernacular construction. The seminar will focus on public intervention projects, that stimulate reinvention and which are participatory, that are not just an object or monument, but a framework to deal with the diverse city life today. Moreover, that can begin to reinvent and reposition more fluid notions of the local. **Discussion – Designing Public Interventions – Understanding the constraints today** "Social space is a space of multiplicity" (Henri Lefebvre) (2) The output of the seminar is to adapt tools and methods to first understand the importance of community building through the 'third space' and how these principles may inform the brief for future design interventions upon (world) heritage sites in need of regeneration.
